

APPLICATION DUE: MARCH 10, 2017**Things to consider when applying to PEOPLE**

1. PEOPLE is a BIG time commitment. We are a year-round college preparation program that requires up to eight hours a week during the school year and 3-5 weeks during the summer.
2. Be ready to find your balance! We fully encourage students to be well-rounded citizens, but our program's priority will always be making sure they are solid in their academics. Being a PEOPLE student will limit your ability to participate in sports, after school clubs, working a job, and participating in community activities.
3. Meeting all eligibility requirements for PEOPLE does not guarantee admission into PEOPLE.
4. Admission into UW–Madison is not guaranteed because you are a PEOPLE student.
5. ONLY Wisconsin residents are eligible to apply and participate in PEOPLE

**HOW TO APPLY:**

1. Submit a completed application online or paper application.
2. Submit a copy of your current school transcript.
3. Submit a completed a DPI form (must be signed by a school official)
4. Submit the teacher recommendation form included in this packet or a letter of recommendation from a teacher or guidance counselor.
5. Submit a one-page autobiography.
6. Submit a one-page essay responding to the following two questions:
 - Why did you decide to apply to PEOPLE? In addition, please share the academic and extracurricular opportunities you want to take advantage of as a participant. If applicable, provide details of any circumstance that may have had an impact on your academic and/or extracurricular involvement?
 - Consider something in your life you think goes unnoticed and write why it's important to you?

Tuition Scholarship Eligibility

Every PEOPLE student who:

- successfully completes the pre-college program,
- is admitted as an undergraduate at UW–Madison,
- completes the eight-week summer bridge-to-college program,
- and completes FAFSA,

May be eligible to receive an in-state undergraduate tuition scholarship for up to four years.

In order to receive the PEOPLE Program scholarship, students must complete the FAFSA. The scholarship will cover in-state tuition only. Expenses for room and board, books, travel, living allowances and other costs are not included.

PLEASE NOTE: Completing the PEOPLE program does not guarantee admission to the University of Wisconsin–Madison. To maintain eligibility for the PEOPLE tuition scholarship, students must meet academic credit, grade point and participation requirements as a PEOPLE College Scholar.
